All the sheep love me because I sneak them honey and fig cakes. Someday I'll be old enough to take care of a whole flock, but right now, I watch over my baby lamb, Hana. She's tiny and cute and super fluffy! But enough about me, what about you? Tell me who you are below!

It's nice to meet you, and I'm glad you're here because, boy, do I have a story for you. It's not a fairytale or a bedtime story—this story is true and happened in my hometown, Bethlehem. In fact, I was there! You might have heard of it before—it's called the Christmas story. Did you know that the Christmas story is all about a kid? He was just like you and me but also completely different because He was God! It sounds crazy, but I promise I'm not trying to pull the wool over your eyes. Like I said, I was there the night He was born. I will never forget what happened that starry night when the heavens lit up, and I saw the craziest, most beautiful sight. Angels filled the sky, celebrating the birth of this amazing little boy! Of course, His story begins long before that special night in my hometown. As you watch His story unfold, I wonder if you might play a game with me. There isn't always much to do when watching sheep all day, so I like to play "Can you Spot...?" Great job! Isn't the story of Jesus' birth amazing? Even though He was born over 2,000 years ago, His birth still changes lives today. Jesus would grow up to heal people from their diseases, show them the love of God, and then give His life to bring you and me into the family of God.

How to Make Why the Nativity? Real in Your Life!

Now that you know His story, let's learn a little more about Jesus. With your family, discuss and answer the questions below!

1. Why did Jesus come as a baby?

Hebrews 4:15 For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin.

The Bible tells us that Jesus understands all our struggles and temptations because He is fully God and fully human. But, for Jesus to understand all we face as humans, he had to start as a baby, just like you and I did. That means whenever you feel sad or happy, go through hard times and good times, Jesus understands because he was once a kid—just like you!

2. Why was His name Jesus?

Matthew 1:21 And she will bring forth a Son, and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins.

When Jesus was born, His name was a common choice for parents to name their sons. It would not have stood out as a unique or powerful name. But, this is the name God told Joseph and Mary to name His Son. The name Jesus means "He will save the people from their sins." The simplest answer? The name tells us exactly what Jesus came to do!

3. Why do we need a savior?

Romans 5:8 But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

The Bible tells us that every single person on earth has the same problem—it's called sin. Even though we can try to be good, we all choose to do what is wrong sometimes. God is so good; He can't be around sin, so it keeps us away from Him. But God loves us and wants to be with us all the time! The only way we can be with God and He can be with us is through a perfect savior—someone who can save us from sin!

4. Why did Jesus come?

John 3:17 For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved.

Jesus came to earth on a rescue mission. In Luke 19:10, He makes his purpose known—"I, the Son of Man, have come to seek and save the lost." But Jesus accomplished this mission at a very high price. Jesus had to give His life so we could be with God today and someday in heaven. Through


His death on the cross and His resurrection from death, we have total forgiveness for our sins. Through Jesus, we can be with God forever!


5. Why do I need to believe in Jesus?

John 3:16 For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.


We've learned that sin is a problem we all have, but Jesus came to be the savior we need. If we understand these truths, the next step is to believe this: Jesus is God, and through His death and resurrection, I am forgiven and brought into God's family! Jesus didn't come because you and I are just bad people who needed help, though; Jesus came because He loves us. Think of someone you love. It could be your parents, brother or sister, or best friend. I bet you want to be around that person, playing with them and spending time together. Jesus feels that way about you, but times a zillion! Jesus wants to be with you, so He came to make a way for you and Him to be together forever. The good news is that to be with Jesus is simple: all you have to do is honestly believe in your heart that Jesus is God and He came to earth to save you. If you've never made the decision to believe in Jesus, and you want to—simply tell Him in your heart right now!





